# Subject: ARMP Expands: Welcoming New Rural Transit Agencies to the Program

#### Virtual Discovery Meetings


Welcome to our new transit agency partners! The Advancing Rural Mobility project team hosted virtual discovery meetings in early December 2024. These sessions brought together new agencies participating in the project and started the integration process of the new agency's service data information into the program's <u>online trip planner tool</u>, enhancing accessibility and usability. The new agencies were chosen based on their technological readiness and geographic location to enhance trip planning features in the online tool.

The next phase of the project will include up to 15 rural transit agencies. The agencies confirmed so far are:
